

Meet the Senate Standing Committee Members

While the Ohio House of Representatives continues to deal with the turmoil and fallout from the Speaker decision, the Senate is moving ahead with business as usual. Multiple standing committees were designated, committee chairs and other leaders named, and members appointed. Health Committee:

Chair: Stephen Huffman (R-Tipp City)



Senator Huffman returns as chair of the Health Committee. He holds a medical degree from the University of Toledo, Medical College of Ohio. He has been a practicing physician at Upper Valley Medical Center and Wayne Hospital for 18 years.

Vice chair: Terry Johnson (R-Scioto County)



Senator Johnson is also a familiar face on the Health Committee. Like his colleague Sen Huffman, he is a physician having graduated from the Ohio University College of Osteopathic Medicine. He is a family practice physician in southern Ohio where he has lived throughout his life. He is also a clinical professor of family medicine at OU and is married with 4 children and 2 grandchildren.

Ranking Minority Member: Nickie Antonio (D-Lakewood)



Senator Antonio is returning to the Health Committee. She holds a Bachelor of Science Degree in education and Master's Degree in public administration from Cleveland State University. In 2011 she was a Bohnett Fellow of the Kennedy School of Harvard University Leadership Program. She was the first member of the LGBTQ community elected to the Ohio House in 2010 and the Ohio Senate in 2018.

Members: Bob Hackett (R-London)



Senator Hackett holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in economics from Columbia where he earned all-conference honors as a member of the football team. He was also recognized as a scholar athlete. He worked in agriculture following his graduation and then began his career in financial services. He is married with one son.

Catherine Ingram (D-Cincinnati)



Senator Ingram holds a Bachelor of Science degree and an MBA from the University of Cincinnati. Prior to her election to the Ohio Senate, she served three terms in the Ohio House and was a member of the Cincinnati Board of Education for over 20 years. She is a practicing realtor.

Kristine Roegner (R-Hudson)



Senator Roegner holds a Bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from Tufts University and an MBA from the Wharton School of Business at the University of Pennsylvania. Prior to serving in public office, she was a field engineer and a management consultant serving global clients focusing on performance and strategic issues. She is married with three children.

Mark Romanchuk (R-Ontario)



Senator Romanchuk served four terms in the Ohio House before his election to the Ohio Senate. He is the owner and CEO of PR Machine Works, a contract manufacturer providing precision machining, fabrication, and assembly services. Prior to that he worked in a diplomatic capacity to the former Soviet Union in support of the Intermediate Ranger Nuclear Forces (INF) Treaty.

Senator Dolan is a graduate of Boston College and the Case Western Reserve University School of Law. He is currently a partner in the law firm of Thrasher, Dinsmore, & Dolan representing business clients. He also manages several area businesses and real estate properties. Prior to his election to the legislature, he was a chief assistant prosecutor for Geauga County and an assistant attorney general for the State of Ohio.

Senator Antani holds a bachelor's degree from The Ohio State University. He was a member of the Ohio House before his election to the senate. He is the first Indian American state senator. Prior to his election to the legislature, he was active in several political campaigns including Romney for President and Congressman Mike Turner's campaign. He was named to Forbes Magazine's list of "Top 30 under 30" in the U.S. for law and politics.

Hearcel Craig (D-Columbus)



Senator Craig holds a Master of Science degree in administration from Central Michigan University and studied at the Ashland Theological Seminary in its Master of Divinity program. He was a Join Together National Leadership Fellow at the Boston University School of Public Health and served two years in the U.S. Army. Before his election to the Ohio Senate, he was a member of the Columbus City Council.

Senator Blessing holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in mathematics and Bachelor of Science degree in engineering from the University of Cincinnati. He is a licensed professional engineer with an extensive background in electrical engineering. He is married with two children.

He held several sales and management positions at Proctor & Gamble before starting his own small business in the financial services industry. He is married with two children.

Nathan Manning (R-North Ridgeville)



Senator Manning holds a bachelor's degree from Denison University and a Juris Doctor degree from Capital University Law School. He served as prosecutor for the city of North Ridgeville and currently owns the law firm Manning & Manning with his sister. He is active in several community organizations.

Senator Schaffer has been a member of the General Assembly since 2000. He earned a bachelor's degree in political science and communications from Mt. Union College and was a fullback on the OAC championship soccer team. In addition to his legislative duties, he has a private sector career as an association executive. Senator Wilson was honorably discharged from the Navy in 1975. He has focused his efforts on community service and his 40-year career with the Lebanon Citizen National Bank from which he retired as CEO and now serves as Chairman of the board.
