Senator Beth Liston is serving her first (1st) term in the Ohio Senate representing northern Franklin County, including Hilliard, Dublin, Worthington, Westerville, New Albany, Gahanna, and portions of Columbus. Prior to her election to the Senate, Liston served three (3) terms in the Ohio House. Her motive for running for public office in 2018 was to bring a better understanding of the impact of policy on health and wellness to the General Assembly. She is passionate about ensuring access to affordable high-quality care for everyone. She believes in public education, economic opportunity, and a state government that works for people.

In addition to her duties as a state senator, she is a practicing physician earning her MD and PhD from The Ohio State University. She trained in Internal Medicine and Pediatrics at Yale New Haven Hospital. When she completed her residency, she joined the faculty at OSU in 2006 and has worked clinically as a hospitalist since then caring for adults and children in the inpatient setting. She is a Professor of Clinical and Internal Medicine and Pediatrics.

Sen. Liston's Senate duties include serving as Ranking Member of both the Senate Health and Medicaid committees while also serving on the Reference, Small Business, Economic Opportunity, and Ways and Means committees.

She is past president of the Columbus Medical Association and resides in the Dublin area with her husband and two children.
